HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

1. COMMIT TO PRAYER & FASTING

Read pages 3-5, which explain why we fast and give practical examples of the types of fasts you can commit to.

Decide on the type of fast you will commit to, and fill out the commitment page on p.7.

2. EACH DAY, READ ABOUT AND PRAY FOR ONE OF THE MISSIONS SUPPORTED BY GRACE OFFERING

Follow along each day to learn more about one of the missionaries or programs supported by Grace Offering. Each day there are specific prayer needs that you can keep in mind, a passage of Scripture to read, and a space to write out your prayers or reflections.

WHY FAST?

At first, fasting may seem foreign or daunting to us, but for the early followers of Jesus it was a way of life. *In giving up food, we experience freedom from worldly comforts and desires.*As our bodies experience physical hunger, it reminds us of the necessity of being dependent on Jesus, the bread of life.

In this time of prayer and fasting, we commit to pray diligently for the missions supported by the Grace Offering. At the same time, we're eager to listen to God's guidance about how we can help spread His kingdom in our own lives.

Our collective prayer is that we will be drawn closer into God's presence and purpose through this time. We pray that God will hear our prayers and stir our hearts to be aligned with his. As we give financially for Grace Offering, we pray that our sacrifice will bring His Kingdom closer to earth.

- Prayer and fasting are long-standing spiritual disciplines that were modeled by Jesus, his disciples, and the early church.
- Prayer connects us to our Father in the supernatural realm.
- Fasting disconnects us from the world and the natural desires of the flesh.

TYPES OF FAST

MAJOR FAST

A major fast is when you abstain from food or drink for twenty-four consecutive hours or more. A major fast requires a certain level of physical health, and it is recommended that you check with your doctor if you're doing a major fast that lasts more than a few days in a row. Some examples from Scripture of a major fast can be found in Matthew 4:2, Acts 9:9, and Esther 4:15-16, just to name a few.

Examples: I will fast all day Monday the 17th - Wednesday the 20th

I will fast all day on Friday the 22nd and Friday the 29th

MINOR FAST

In a minor fast, you choose to abstain from food for a certain period of time (i.e., 6 a.m. to 3 p.m. or sunup to sundown). This fast is sometimes called a "Jewish fast," and it can last for days at a time, eating only at a set time of the day. In a minor fast, most people will drink liquids during the day and have one small meal after sundown each evening.

Examples: I will fast during my lunch break each day and use the time for prayer

I will fast from breakfasts and lunches from Wednesday the 27th - Friday the 29th.

PARTIAL FAST

A partial fast is when you give up only certain foods during the course of your fast. This fast is seen most clearly in Daniel 1, where Daniel abstains from certain foods out of devotion to God for a period of time. During a partial fast, some people choose to give up certain foods they enjoy in an effort to turn their hearts more deeply toward God.

Examples: My family will refrain from eating at restaurants or getting take-out these 2 weeks, to contribute the money we save towards Grace Offering

I will eat only fruits and vegetables for the week before Easter.

SOUL FAST

Technically speaking, biblical fasting only refers to abstaining from food or drink (or both) for a spiritual purpose. However, some people choose to fast from things other than food. **Some people will give up television**, **social media**, **or other activities for a soul fast to focus on prayer**.

Example: I will not use social media for these 2 weeks and use the time for prayer instead.

I will cut out all unnecessary spending, to contribute the money I save towards Grace Offering.

Each of these fasts can be a valuable way of connecting with God more deeply. If you are physically able, though, I would encourage you to prayerfully consider one of the first three fasts. There is something about giving up food that physically and spiritually realigns you in ways nothing else can.



ILAD partners with local communities in under-resourced regions to provide economic, social and agricultural development. They are currently running a demonstration farm that provides agricultural training to rural farmers. This program provides Togolese farmers with hands-on training in organic pineapple and peanut production. This gives farmers the skills they need to increase their annual income and improve their economic situation.

Last summer, a team including Park Avenue members partnered with Late Lawson and his team with ILAD and travelled to Tsevie, Togo to conduct a 7-day eye clinic serving over 800 patients. They were blessed to see the many ways that God is working in Togo!

In July 2019, God called Kevin
Dale and Greg Clay to begin a
Bible study at the home of Bubba
Smith, a former Durant drug dealer
whose heart was being prepared
by God to become a fisher of men!
Despite initial uncertainty from
Kevin and Greg, when asked about
the opportunity Bubba responded,
"when are we going to begin?"

Starting with just 7 attendees in Bubba's yard, the group began to study the gospel, witnessing a steady increase in participants. By February, five individuals were baptized. As the study expanded, they outgrew their meeting space, yet God provided a tent for winter gatherings. Miraculous provisions and spiritual transformations characterized the group, now called "The Turning Point."

In just four years, over 875 different people have attended, with 48

baptized and 75 rededicating their lives to God. 50 to 60 attend on a weekly basis, demonstrating the powerful movement of the Holy Spirit in South Durant and beyond.

Sebastian, Raquel, and their children Hadid. Joas. and Jocabed work with the Cartagena Church of Christ. They have been actively engaged in various ministries throughout the past year, with a focus on evangelism, restoration, discipleship, and community outreach. They have successfully reinstated face-to-face meetings through home groups, allowing for deeper fellowship and training of small group leaders. Additionally, they have utilized technology for virtual weekday prayer sessions, fostering spiritual connectivity among members.

Recent victories include 9 new believers being baptized, a youth worship gathering, an outreach to provide food to a needy area, and training for worship leaders, including Jorge, whose transformation from a 40-year drug addict to a committed servant of God has been particularly inspiring.

has 46 beds, a dining area, laundry facilities, a food pantry, restrooms, an outdoor playground, and the offices that support the shelter.

The Barnabas Center is an outreach ministry that distributes food to those in need. Every other week on Wednesdays and Thursdays, they open their doors to our neighbors and let them browse the shelves for the food items that they need most.

Barnabas continues to grow year after year and has been tremendously blessed. This year they have received generous grants from North Texas Food Bank and United Way, which allowed them to purchase new equipment, as well as provide over 1,800 "to-go kits" for Denison ISD students who need food over the weekend.

In 2023, they served 5,623 individuals from 2,294 households. All of this was made possible by the 2,993 hours of volunteer work from 85 volunteers. We praise God for the work He is doing through Barnabas!

Alejandro and Darling, along with their children Alejandro and Zoe, are a family newly supported by Park Avenue this year!


